Mary Bishop was born on March 6, 1909, the fourth child of Peter and Margaret (Henige) Bishop, who lived in the Maple Grove area. She became ill with multiple sclerosis in high school and gradually became worse. After graduation she applied to enter the Sisters of St. Joseph. They were reluctant to accept her but finally agreed when they saw how much she desperately wanted to do this and how sincere she was. At the time, it was unknown what illness she had. She took the name of Sister Margaret Ann S.J. when she entered the convent.

Sister Margaret was a very kind-hearted person and was well liked by everyone, helping out when she could. She helped Art and Marianne at different times when a new baby was born and etc. Art & Marianne having a large family, this was very much appreciated.



Sister Margaret Ann was a bridesmaid at Marianne (Fedewa) and Arthur Bishop's wedding on June 11, 1932.

Sister Margaret was a teacher and librarian in two parishes in Detroit. Later on, her illness prevented her from teaching. She was hospitalized the final years at Borgess Hospital. She was very sweet and welcoming. She focused on how everyone else was doing and did not complain about being an invalid. We (Art & Marianne and kids) visited her monthly. She was close to Art & Marianne.

Margaret passed away June 9, 1962. She is revered as a Saint by her order – "The Sisters of St. Joseph".

Margaret is buried at Nazareth Cemetery in Kalamazoo, Michigan.

The following information was provided by Sr. Elizabeth Bishop (Father – Alphonse Bishop) who received the letter below from Sr. Marilyn of the Sisters of St. Joseph at Nazareth.

Sr. Margaret Ann Bishop March 6, 1909 – June 9, 1962

Mary Bishop was born in Maple Grove, Michigan March 6, 1909. Her parents were Peter Joseph Bishop, born in Norwalk, Ohio and Margaret Henige, born in Maple Grove. Mary entered the Sisters of St. Joseph at Nazareth from St. Michael Parish, Maple Grove, October 14, 1935, and received the habit and the name Sister M. Margaret Ann August 25, 1936. She made her first vows August 26, 1938, and her final profession August 26, 1941.

Sister was assigned to domestic duties and served at Saint Bernard's for a time. For many years before her death, however, she was confined to Borgess Hospital with a serious illness which became so bad that she was completely helpless. During this entire time, she was cheerful, extremely patient in her suffering, and thoughtful of others.

Sister Margaret Ann died at Borgess Hospital June 9, 1962 after having spent fourteen years there, suffering from multiple sclerosis.

Memories of Uncle Herb and Aunt Anna By Victor Herbert Bishop

When we kids were small and it was time for harvesting, Uncle Herb would come out and help Dad (Alphonse) shock corn by hand. He and his brother Alphonse were pretty close. Dad would cut the corn during the day and Uncle Herb and Dad would stand it up and bundle about 10 – 12 bundles together to get it into the shock.

I also used to enjoy hearing Uncle Herb talk about his hunting trips. He was quite a hunter enjoying both deer hunting and pheasant hunting. I don't remember much about Aunt Anna other than she died at a young age. I do remember her visiting and Mom (Mary Bishop) and Aunt Rose Bishop (Uncle Harold's wife) would do her hair as if she had gone to a beautician. I remember how happy it made her to have her hair done by them.

I remember a collie dog the family had that didn't have any hair. Most people thought the dog was sick but it was a nice dog.

There were many visits to the house by Uncle Herb who would come to the area from Flint to visit his parents and would always stop in to see Mom (Mary) and Dad (Alphonse). I also remember Uncle Herb being the head of the union when I worked at Plant 36 for Buick back in 1947-48 timeframe.

RESIDENT OF THE MONTH: HERB BISHOP!!

HERB BISHOP WAS BORN FEBRUARY 6, 1911 AND GREW UP ON A FARM IN MAPLE GROVE TOWNSHIP, MICHIGAN. HE WAS THE 6TH OF 10 CHILDREN BORN TO PETER AND MARGARET BISHOP.

SHORTLY AFTER GRADUATING FROM ST. MICHAEL'S HIGH SCHOOL, HE HAD A WHIRLWIND COURTSHIP WITH A VERY PRETTY AND PETITE MISS ANNA VOLLER. THEY MARRIED APRIL 18, 1936. HERB WORKED AT FARMING AND ROAD CONSTRUCTION PRIOR TO TAKING A JOB AT BUICK IN THE TOOL AND DYE DIVISION. HE WORKED THERE FOR 30 YEARS. HERB WAS ALSO ACTIVE IN THE UAW. HE WAS A UNION REPRESENTATIVE AND EDITOR OF THE UNION PAPER FOR A TIME. HERB WROTE MANY LETTERS TO EDITORS OF LOCAL PAPERS, ENCOURAGING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF SOCIAL SECURITY.

WHEN ANNA DIED IN 1963, HERB FINISHED THE JOB OF RAISING THEIR 8 CHILDREN. HE WAS NOT ONE TO SLOW DOWN AFTER HIS RETIREMENT FROM BUICK MOTOR DIVISION. HE OBTAINED A REAL ESTATE LICENSE AND BOUGHT HUD HOMES. AFTER RECONDITIONING THE HOUSES HE WOULD RENT OR SELL THEM. HERB FOUNDED THE CATHOLIC SOCIAL CLUB FOR WIDOWS, WIDOWERS, AND SINGLES IN THE AREA. HE WAS A MEMBER OF THE TOAST MASTERS.

IN HIS SPARE TIME, HERB ENJOYED SPORTS AND Hobbies SUCH AS FISHING, DEER AND PHEASANT HUNTING, BOWLING, GOLF, FOOTBALL, BASEBALL, AND BASKETBALL. HE CAME TO G.B.C.C. IN DECEMBER 1987 AND CONTINUES TO ENJOY BOWLING AS WELL AS MENS' CLUB AND OTHER ACTIVITIES. STOP AND SAY 'HI' TO HERB TODAY!!





Al Bishop was very athletic and played many sports. He provided the following write-up:

Service Career – Football and Basketball

1957-58 Kindley Air Force Base, Bermuda – Football, Basketball and Softball

I would have been a senior in high school. I quit high school to join the Air Force and played against many All Americans and Pro Players. We didn't win many games, however, I learned a lot.

In the 50's and early 60's, all men had to serve in the military. So I had the opportunity to play vs. pros and top college players in all sports.

Basketball players, Johnny Green, Wally Choice, Al Ferri, Si Green and KC Jones (Celtics) to name a few. Baltimore YMCA team was made up of many retired Baltimore Bullets players. We never beat them, but gave them a couple of good games.

1959-60 Basketball and Baseball – Dover AFB, Delaware.

Played vs. Harlem Magicians and Marques Haynes - 1960

Baseball – played 1st base and pitched in the Del-mar League. I talked to many pro scouts and I told them I was going to college and play football at Michigan State.

1960 – Wilmington DE – Independent City League – Baseball pitcher. Made the all-star team.

1960 – Dover AFB – Military Air Transport Service – All Star Team – Basketball

1960 – Chateauroux, France – Football – played end both ways
Basketball – played center and forward

Discharged January, 1961

1961 - Try-out Detroit Tigers – Pitcher

I had a try-out at Atwood Stadium and was invited to Tiger Stadium for an All Star game with players from other try-out camps from Indiana, Illinois and Ohio. I did OK, struck out 3 in 2 innings and we talked about spring training, but no offer was made when they found out I was 22 years old and wanted to play college football.

1961-1962 Basketball Season – City of Flint League Class A High scorer
Averaging 20.8 points per game.

College Career – Central Michigan University 1962 – 1965

Captain Robert Swett was my football coach in Bermuda and was helping me get a scholarship to Michigan State. I did not pass the entrance test. CMU accepted me on my GED diploma. So that is how I ended up there.

1962 - I went to the Red Feather game vs. Northern Michigan and decided I really wanted to play football again. I called Coach Kelly (I had met him when I went to visit Pat Arsenault who played at CMU) and he told me to come on up. Two games had already been played. I arrived on Tuesday and started the next game. I started every game for the next four years except one due to injury.

Back then you could go to school for one semester and drop out of the next semester to work. This is what I had to do so I could afford to continue my schooling. My scholarship only covered my tuition and books. I had to pay my

own rent and food. My junior year I went to school all year. In 1964, I made the baseball team and went on the spring trip and pitched in the clean-up duties. When I got back to CMU, spring football was just starting and coach (Bill Kelly) told me to get a uniform and get back to where my scholarship was. That ended my career as a CMU baseball player.

I talked to general manager Jim Finks of the Minnesota Vikings and was offered a contract to play for them. I chose the Houston Oilers because I didn't want to play at Minnesota in the winter time. I signed with the Houston Oilers Professional Football Team – 1966.

During training camp I had an injury to my knee that ended my career.

Golf – 1992 Clio Country Club Senior Champion with a 75 actual and a 10 handicap in the first flight for a 65.

I have been blessed to have had sports in my life. It gave me opportunities I never would have had to travel the world and meet so many great people. It also brought discipline into my life and a sense of purpose. Some of the very best friends I have today were teammates in college. It also indirectly gave me the opportunity to meet my wife. I was looking through my yearbook when I was home for Christmas break and saw a picture of one of my teammates from the baseball team and remembered he had dated this cute girl from Flint. So I called her up and asked for a date and we have been married 45 years in August. So as you can see, sports has been very good to me.

After college, my work life included owning a liquor delivery business for 19 years. After selling it, I sold liquor for a while (3-4 years). Then I went to work as a Budweiser beer salesman in Flint.

Pat and I moved to Traverse City, Michigan in 1995. Pat was working for the American Red Cross and got transferred to Traverse City. I got bored with retirement and started driving a school bus for Traverse City schools in 1996. I retired from that job in 2003 and I am still driving as a substitute now.
